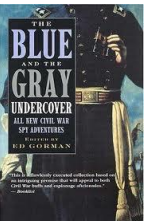


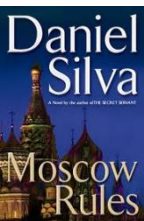
SPIES: The Great Game

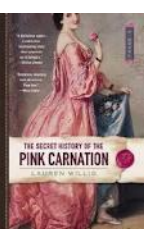
MOSCOW RULES (GABRIEL ALLON MYSTERY #8) | Daniel Silva

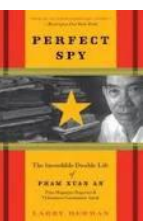
MRS. POLLIFAX UNVEILED (MRS. POLLIFAX MYSTERY #14) | Dorothy Gilman

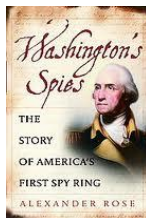


THE SECRET HISTORY OF THE PINK CARNATION | Lauren Willig

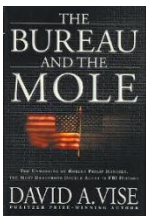

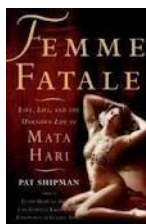

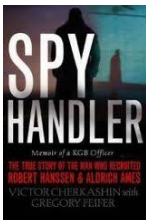
WASHINGTON'S SPIES: THE STORY OF AMERICA'S FIRST SPY RING | Alexander Rose
