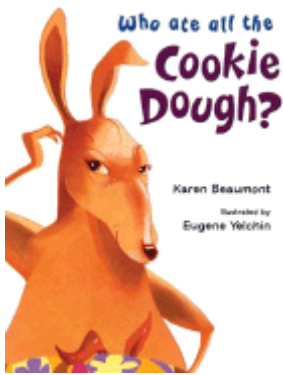
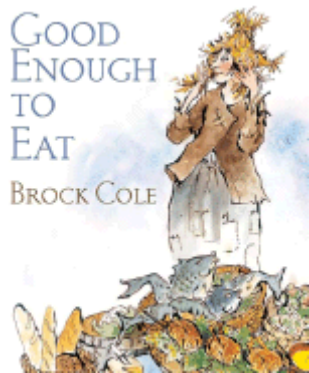


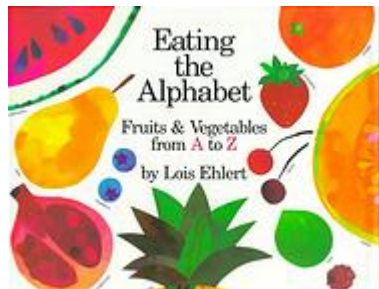
Yummy! Yummy! : Picture Books about Food

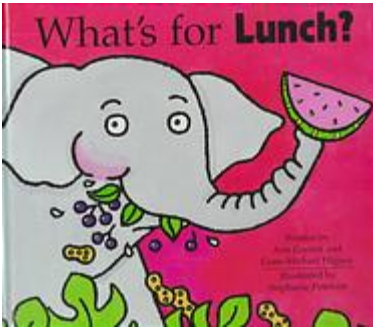
Ehlert, Lois. *Eating the Alphabet.* 1989. E Ehle.
An alphabetical tour of the world of fruits and vegetables from apricot and artichoke to yam and zucchini.



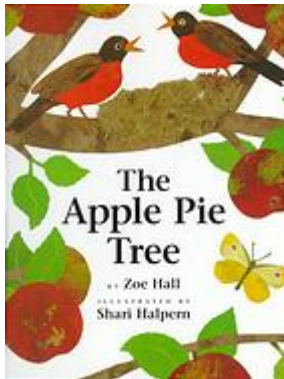
Fleming, Denise. *Lunch.* 1992. E Flem.
A very hungry mouse eats a large lunch comprised of colorful foods.



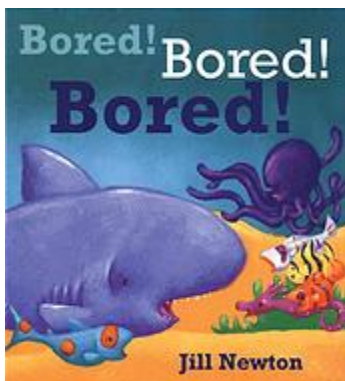
French, Jackie. *Too Many Pears*. 2003. E Fren.
Pamela the cow loves pears so much that no one else ever has a chance to eat any.



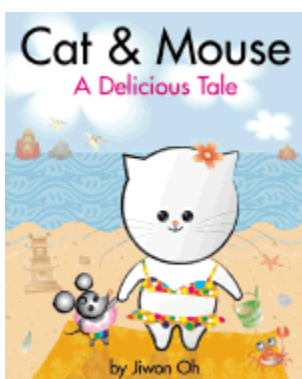
Garrett, Ann. *What's for Lunch?* 1999. E Garr.
A lift-the-flap book the illustrates what different animals are having for lunch.



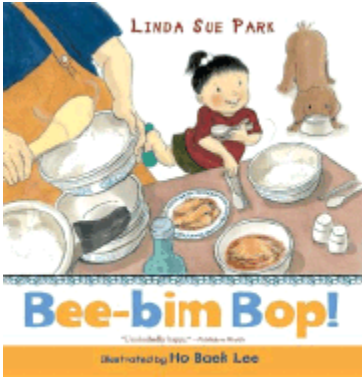
Hall, Zoe. *The Apple Pie Tree*. 1996. E Hall.

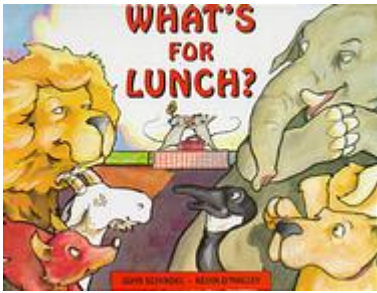
Newton, Jill. *Bored! Bored! Bored!* 2002. E Newt.

A cookbook makes cat think about what a delicious meal her best friend, Mouse, would make but she dismisses the idea because he is such a good friend.



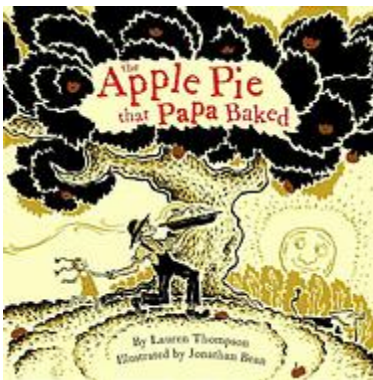
Park, Linda Sue. *Bee-Bim Bop!* 2005. E Park.

A funny tale about a series of animals that almost interrupt Sidney the mouse's plans for lunch.



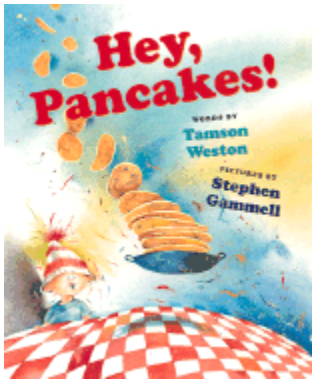
Shaw, Nancy. *Raccoon Tune.* 2003. E Shaw.
